- 1) **Why is it so important to for us to have a desire as is expressed in the words, “Teach me O LORD?”**
Psalm 86:11-12; Micah 6:8; Eph. 4:21-24; Eph. 2:11-13; Matt. 11:28-30

- 2) **What are the Heavenly Father’s statutes?**

- 3) **Is there a difference between God’s statutes, law, and commandments?**
Dan. 7:12; Eph. 6:2; Matt. 5:44; Gal. 5:14; Rom. 7:12,14; Psalm 40:8; Mal. 2:6; James 2:8; Gal. 6:22; John 15:17

- 4) **What is the type of attitude/important characteristic that is being taught in our lesson? See the words (give me, incline my heart, turn away my eyes from vanity, fear/reverence).**
2 Cor. 3:3; I Peter 3:15; Matt. 5:8; Eph. 6:6; I Peter 5:5,6; Isaiah 57:15

- 5) **Please explain how the expressions (“I will walk, I will speak, I will delight, I will lift up my hands, I will meditate.”) may fit into our vowel of consecration?**

- 6) **Verse 42 says, “So shall I have where with to answer him that reproacheth me; for I have trust in thy word.” How does this compare to the words expressed in I Peter 3:15-17, “Be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason for the hope that is in you?”**

- 7) **In verse 48 the Psalmist states that he has loved God’s commandments. Can you tie in this verse to help us with the application of these words? “Love worketh no ill to his neighbor: therefore love is the fulfilling of the law.”—Romans 13:10; Also, what standard did Jesus place before his followers, and how can we obtain it?**
